Appendix 3- Systematic Review Classification Criteria

- 1. Check the abstract for the criteria listed below.
- 2. If it is not clear from the abstract if the paper is a systematic review based on criteria, then the full text must be retrieved for evaluation.
- 3. If it is still not clear, mark with "?" and discuss with 2nd reviewer.
- 4. If not clear with either reviewer, mark with the original publication type assigned.

Criteria:

- Specific clinical question
- Documentation of methods to identify literature
 - If author states it was "comprehensively" or "systematically" done then that fulfills this criteria
 - If using electronic databases (must use more than one database)
 - If using other resource types, must demonstrate use of multiple sources for identifying studies
- Inclusion and/or exclusion criteria noted
- Synthesis noted
